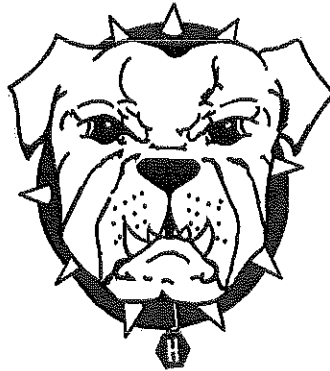

Dear Students and Parents of Grades 6, 7, and 8:

We are proud to present to you our club and activity offerings for the 2017-2018 school year. Please take time to review the selection. We encourage all students to participate. Most clubs begin during the week of September 25 and continue through to the week of May 28. Unless otherwise specified, most before school activities start at 7:15 am and end at 7:50 am, and most after school clubs start at 3:00 pm and end at 3:50 pm. Meeting times are subject to change and will be advertised to students. Activity advisors make every effort to communicate changes with club members. Please check our daily announcements/Twitter feed for updated information. Students should also confirm meeting dates with the activity advisor. Please note that in addition to when school is closed for students, after school activities do not meet on half days.

Students may sign up for as many clubs, sports, and activities as they wish for we have a “no cut – no limit” approach here at the Middle School (with a few exceptions). Students should schedule the first and subsequent meetings of the activities they wish to join in their agenda books, so they are sure to attend. Students are encouraged to attend a meeting to decide whether they wish to participate. However, students should remember that homework comes first and should consider homework and other time demands when making their selections. Unless selection procedures are specified, a student can join a club at any time. However, in order to participate in a sport, one must complete and submit online Athletic Registration to participate in sports (including Winter Running Club). Click on the district athletics link on the Haddonfield home page – it will take you to the Registration portal.

**Please be informed that a yearly activity fee of \$75 must be paid at the start of the school year before a student can participate in any club, sport, or activity. Participation may be denied if the fee is not received. The yearly activity fee for two or more students in the Middle School is \$125. Please make checks payable to: HMS Student Activity Account and send it in with the (completed) form on the last page (15).**

### **Middle School Philosophy for Activities and Participation**

*The activity and athletic programs of Haddonfield Middle School help students to develop a positive self-image, foster a sense of belonging, and increase student interest and participation in extra-curricular activities that will extend into high school, college, and community. In addition, the programs are designed to foster the development of life-skills, positive values, leadership, service, and healthy habits, so that personal growth and development results with an emphasis on skill development and improvement, personal best, cooperation and team spirit, rather than focus on the high levels of performance/competition. Activities, Clubs, and Athletic Programs offer opportunity and instruction to any and all interested students at a developmentally appropriate level.*

## School Sponsored Athletic Programs

### Requirements for Participation:

1. a valid School Health Examination dated after June 1<sup>st</sup> on file with the school nurse
2. a completed Medical Questionnaire online form
3. a signed Parent Permission online form
4. a signed Parent/Student-Athlete Expectation online form
5. maintained academic eligibility
6. paid activity fee

### Transportation:

Transportation will be provided to all away events. All student athletes are expected to travel on the team bus. Exceptions may be granted in emergencies and only parent/guardians can drive their own children. The procedure is to seek permission of the head coach, with a written request from the parent/guardian. These requests must be made at least 24 hours in advance, except in extenuating circumstances.

### Attendance:

Attendance is mandatory for all practice meetings and games. Each student athlete has an obligation to attend every team session. If a student athlete must miss a practice, the student athlete must notify the head coach in person no later than the previous day. An absence will result in the athlete not being permitted to play in the next game/meet.

### Behavior:

Student athletes should abide by school rules and standards of behavior. Deviation from these rules may lead to dismissal from the team.

### Attitude:

Come to practice with a good attitude. Understand that the coaches are there to make you and the team better. Listen to corrections and do not take constructive criticism personally. Coaches and athletes are all striving to reach the same goals, by working together; you will attain your goals.

### Communication:

Communication is of utmost importance for a successful program. Student athletes must display the ability to take direction, to get along with teammates and the coaching staff, and to share information and concerns. Parents should ask questions and keep the coaching staff informed of student issues that arise during the season.

**ACTIVITY DESCRIPTIONS**

**Animal Welfare Club**

**Advisor: Mrs. Scott**

The Animal Welfare Club will provide students with information and programs about animals and the role they play in the lives of people. Students will learn how animals help humans by providing companionship and acting as service animals. The club will give students a chance to plan and participate in projects that help animals. The club will inform participants about volunteering opportunities.

**Band - 6<sup>th</sup> Grade (Intermediate)**

**Advisor: Mr. Corvino**

This ensemble meets twice a cycle during tutorial period on Days 3 & 6 to rehearse. Students of all playing levels are encouraged to join if they enjoy music! Students perform at school concerts, community functions, Middle School Promotion, mall concerts, and at an annual Hershey Park Festival.

Students may audition for All South Jersey regional ensembles and eligible students may participate in the Camden County Arts 4 Teens Festival. Small group lessons are offered to instrumental students who participate. Lessons are given on a rotating basis to insure minimal impact upon academic and associative arts classes. Students should have an instrument to use during lessons, rehearsals, performances, and for home practice. Students must commit quarterly for this program.

### **Band - 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade (Junior)**

**Advisor: Mr. Corvino**

This ensemble meets twice a cycle during tutorial period on Days 1 & 4 to rehearse. Students of all playing levels are encouraged to join if they enjoy music! Students perform at school concerts, community functions, Middle School Promotion, mall concerts, and at an annual Hershey Park Festival. Students may audition for All South Jersey regional ensembles and eligible students may participate in the Camden County Arts 4 Teens Festival. Small group lessons are offered to instrumental students who participate. Lessons are given on a rotating basis to insure minimal impact upon academic and associative arts classes. ### **Battle of the Books**

Do you love to read? Are you competitive? Well, Battle of the Books is the program for you!! The goals of the program are to encourage reading for pleasure; to broaden reading interest; and to recognize students who enjoy reading. Students participate in teams of four to six members who read a selection of books over a period of months. The students discuss them, quiz each other on the contents, and then compete together to correctly answer questions based on the books. Students compete against other teams in HMS as well as schools throughout Camden County and Southern New Jersey. The state-wide program involves a cooperative effort by many individuals and The New Jersey Association of School Librarians (NJASL). It is always popular with students and has provided new opportunities for academic competition. Battle of the Books has proven itself to be effective in stimulating and motivating an interest in reading.

### **Bulldawg Buddies**

**Advisors: Mrs. Papa and Mrs. Miller**

Bulldawg Buddies is a club designated for 8<sup>th</sup> grade students who are interested in mentoring and developing relationships with first grade students in Central Elementary School. Students will meet together once a cycle during their tutorial period. Students will be engaged in a variety of activities that will foster a love of learning. Learn how to provide a safe learning environment for young children so that they can reach their highest potential.

### **Cake Decorating Club**

**Advisor: Mrs. Sanchirico**

Do you have an interest in the culinary arts? At cake club, you will learn the decorating techniques of professional bakers and be able to decorate your own cupcake to enjoy! The club meets every other Tuesday after school. Students can sign up for individual sessions with a maximum of 20 students per session.

### **Chorus – Grade 6**

**Advisor: Mrs. Murray**

This ensemble meets twice a cycle during tutorial period on Days 1 & 4. The focus of this ensemble is to continue the development of vocal technique for all interested singers and to perform. Sixth Grade Choir takes two trips during the school year, one for a local winter performance and the other to Rowan University to participate in a choral festival. This ensemble also performs in the Sixth Grade Winter and Spring Concerts. Students are also encouraged to audition for state and regional choirs for advanced singing opportunities; this is an optional part of the program. Sixth Grade Choir is for those who really enjoy singing!



## Chorus – Grades 7 and 8

Advisor: Mrs. Murray

Chorus rehearses twice a cycle during Tutorial. 7<sup>th</sup> grade girls rehearse on Day 5; 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade boys rehearse on Day 2; and 8<sup>th</sup> grade girls rehearse on Day 6. Students perform at school concerts in December and May, and at community functions, Middle School Promotion, mall concerts, and a Hershey Park festival. Students may audition for All South Jersey regional ensembles and eligible students may participate in the Camden County Arts 4 Teens Festival. Students must make a yearlong commitment to attend all rehearsals and performances.

## Computer Coding Club

Advisor: Mr. Maguire

Did you know that computer science is the top paying college degree and one of the most in-demand jobs in the world today? You can use computer science skills to do everything from creating games to saving lives. These skills help you to become a better thinker. Join the club to help understand how the “language of computer science” could be critical to ensuring that you are not left in the dark ages! During this course, students will learn the basics of computer coding through specifically designed software for middle school students. Using the code.org resources, students will be able to write codes to create their own animation, virtual stories, and basic video games. Participating students must have access to an email address, must be comfortable sitting for long periods of time, and should be able to process verbal and written instructions.

## Cross Country

Coaches: Mrs. Baker and Ms. Baker

The middle school cross country program exposes the team members to distance training and racing at the 1.5 mile distance. Students of all ability levels and experience are welcome to become part of the program. They will be challenged to steadily progress in their training and improve in their performances. The season starts in early September and runs through late October. Season practices will include a combination of practices at the middle school and the high school. The team competes in Colonial Conference dual meets and championships meets. Practice and meet schedules will be posted on the team website. **A physical is required to participate. Please submit all the athletic participation forms online before the club start date. Click “Online Registration” on the district athletics homepage.**

## Drama Club

Director: Mr. Maxson (Fall Play)/Mr. Hecker (Spring Musical)

Members of the Drama Club pull it all together to present a play each Fall (September to October) and a musical each Spring (January to April). Club members may perform on stage or work on scenery, advertising, lighting, or sound. Students audition for performing roles. The number one requirement is: Commitment! If a student demonstrates a lack of commitment, the student may be asked not to participate. Expectations for participation and a club schedule are given to students and parents prior to auditions. First auditions for the Fall Play and Spring Musicals will be announced as the time draws near and held in the Middle School Auditorium. Those who receive acting roles will be required to memorize a script. A rehearsal schedule will be made and distributed during auditions. During the last two weeks

before “show time,” rehearsals are held Monday through Thursday from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. There are Saturday rehearsals for the Fall Play and the Spring Musical. The number of participants is limited due to the physical size of the stage. Drama Club is open to all grades.

### **Field Hockey**

**Coach: Ms. Trotman**

Our Field Hockey program, under the expert guidance of our coaches, develops the fundamental skills involved with passing, ball handling, scoring, defense, and teamwork. The season starts with an interest meeting. Please listen to the morning announcements for the date and time. Game days vary. 6<sup>th</sup> grade uses the Middle School field; 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade uses Tatem’s field. **A physical is required to participate. Please submit all the athletic participation forms online before the club start date. Click “Online Registration” on the district athletics homepage.**

### **Friends of Rachel Club**

**Advisors: Mrs. Goldenberg/Ms. Aquino**

The Friends of Rachel Club is a group of compassionate students who meet regularly to work on ideas and projects for students and our school that make students at HMS feel important. FOR Club formed after a moving school assembly about the life of Rachel Joy Scott. Rachel’s life ended tragically in a school shooting, but the story and legacy of her life focused on her commitment to recognizing the good in others continues on and is inspirational.

### **History Club**

**Advisor: Mrs. McComas**

Calling all those interested in ancient history, mythology, and even Harry Potter! In History Club this year, we will take on ancient building projects with STEM challenges, as well as investigate the myths that are behind the magic of the Harry Potter series. We will meet on Wednesdays at 3!

### **Jazz Band**

**Advisor: Mr. Corvino**

The Jazz Band meets on Fridays, before school, at 7:10 sharp, starting on or around October 6<sup>th</sup>. Listen for announcements. If you love to perform jazz music or wish to learn how, this club is for you! Students should possess an instrument to use during rehearsals and performances. All students are welcome to join!

### **Leadership Club**

**Advisor: Mr. Maxson**

This club is open to 7<sup>th</sup> grade students who wish to join our FutureAct Peer Leadership Program in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Attendance and completion of the program is mandatory to become a Peer Leader if one did not go through the selection process at the end of 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Students will develop their own leadership styles,

enhance their communication and facilitation skills, and make presentations to 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade classes. Listen for announcements and come to our interest meeting!

### **Math Counts**

**Advisor: Ms. Resnick**

MATHCOUNTS is a collaborative and competitive club that continues to grow with excellence each year. It is designed to allow students to have more involvement with various strands of Mathematics (Arithmetic, Probability, Algebra, etc.) in an effort to sharpen their skills and critically think about scenarios that can be solved through the usage of Mathematics. Students can look forward to having fun with Math through individual, partner and group work. Our competition team competes regionally, hoping to move on to the State competition. Come fire-up your brain! We meet Thursday mornings! Our competition is held in late January or early February.

### **Morning Library**

Morning Library: The HMS library is open every morning from 7:30- 7:50. Students may use this quiet time to complete homework, use the computers for printing and typing, plus study for tests and quizzes.

### **Newspaper Publication**

The school newspaper is written for our students, by our students. It is published at least once during each marking period and is distributed to all students during school. Club members work collaboratively with Mrs. Sanchirico, at individual work sessions, to produce the paper. The paper presents relevant discourse on school and community issues. Aspiring journalists need only a love of writing, a sense of curiosity, and a nose for news. That is all that is required! Each member will set up an individualized meeting schedule with Mrs. Sanchirico.

### **Paw Print Literary Magazine**

**Advisors: Mrs. O'Neill**

The Paw Print literary magazine is a student generated publication composed of poems, short stories, creative writing, comics, drawings, and photographs. Staff members meet weekly to create their own pieces for publication as well as read, review, and provide feedback on items that have been submitted. The Paw Print literary magazine is distributed to the HMS student body in the spring. There will be an interest meeting in September!

### **Peer-to-Peer Leadership Program – Grade 7**

**Advisors: Mrs. Cannaday/Mr. Thomas**

Leadership minded students may apply to participate in this statewide program developed by the Princeton Center for Leadership Training. Students are selected in May of their 6<sup>th</sup> grade year and are trained to present programs, when they are in 7<sup>th</sup> grade, to 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students to help them learn

how to resist smoking tobacco, drinking alcoholic beverages, and experimenting with other drugs. They also address issues that may contribute too, or result from, experimentation. They organize the school-wide Shoebox Project for children of South Jersey's migrant workers. This group meets each Thursday, at 7:15 a.m., in the Cafeteria, to learn and practice group facilitation skills, communication skills, and to prepare their presentations. *Please note: To be a Peer-to-Peer Leader, you must attend a mandatory training day in September.*

### **Peer Leadership Program – FutureAct - Grade 8**

**Advisors: Mrs. Miller/Mrs. Probst/Ms. Aquino**

This program is a part of the Haddonfield Rotary Club's FutureAct Program. While this program is a continuation of the Peer-to-Peer Program, there is a strong added emphasis upon service to the school and community. During the year, some of the activities include: facilitate group activities during morning CPRs, organize drives to collect various items for the needy, help with the Shoebox Project, collect items for our Mother's Day Baskets Drive for needy single mothers in Camden County, assist with school functions such as Back to School Night and Parent/Teacher Conferences. Peer Leaders apply for membership in May of the 7<sup>th</sup> grade year. The group meets each Wednesday, at 7:15 a.m. in the Cafeteria, to fine-tune leadership skills. Peer Leaders are expected to be great role models for their classmates. *Please note: To be a Peer Leader you must attend a mandatory training day in September.*

### **Sea Perch**

**Advisor: Mr. Kozak**

Sea Perch is a club which has a main focus on underwater robotics. Throughout the year, members of this club will focus on working together in order to solve a problem posed by the event organizers from the National Sea Perch Organization. The solution generated from the club will be taken to a competition in early spring when the club will compete against other clubs from around the Delaware Valley in both performance and documentation challenges. Members will gain experience working with many different building materials and will work together to construct a remote controlled underwater device. Members of this club will learn about the topics of buoyancy, ballast, design planning, prototyping, and team work.

### **Strategy Gaming Club**

Get your game on! Strategy club is a place for students to enjoy their favorite board games, trading card games and video games. Students will also have the opportunity to learn new games throughout the year as well. Members of this club will learn probability, game theory, good sportsmanship and game strategy as they learn new games and begin to master games of old.

### **String Ensemble (Orchestra) - Grades 6, 7, and 8**

The Middle School String Ensemble rehearses once a cycle during tutorial period on Day 3. 6<sup>th</sup> grade members also rehearse during Tutorial on Day 5 and 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade members have an additional rehearsal during Tutorial on Day 2. Students must either play or have the desire to learn how to play a stringed instrument. Students perform at school concerts, community functions, Middle School

Promotion, mall concerts, and at an annual Hershey Park Festival. Students may audition for All South Jersey regional ensembles and eligible students may participate in the Camden County Arts 4 Teens Festival. Small group lessons are offered to instrumental students who participate. Lessons are given on a rotating basis to insure minimal impact upon academic and associative arts classes. Students should have a string instrument to use during lessons, rehearsals, performances, and for home practice. Students must commit quarterly for this program.

### Student Council

Advisors: Mrs. Munz/ Mrs. Verdeur

The Middle School Student Council is an elected group of student officers and homeroom representatives who drive service-oriented projects, contribute to the improvement and good of the order of the school, promotes school pride, spirit, and morale. Representatives organize and participate in a variety of activities that benefit charity organizations and community outreach programs and plan special school events such as Spirit Week. Student Council will meet on the first Tuesday of each month starting the first week in October. Applications will be made available the third week of September. Students will read their statements to their CPR classmates on the last Friday of September. Each CPR will select two representatives and 1 alternate to represent their CPR.

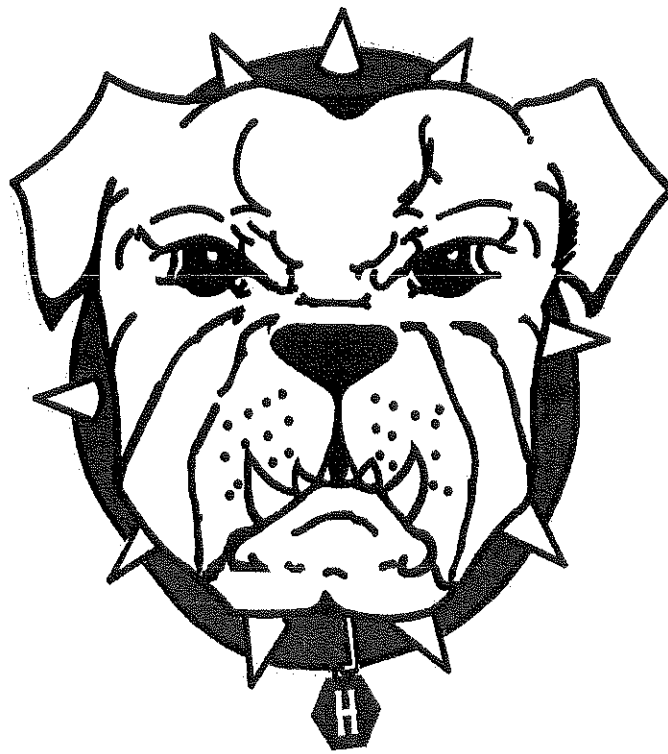
### Yearbook Club
